

WORKING PLAN

Throughout the year, we will observe one tree, most probably linden which stands on our front yard. At the end of the project we will exchange seedlings and plant them in a prominent place.

Otherwise, our work will concentrate on different months and the condition in the forest at certain time of the year.

OCTOBER:



chestnut picnic,



products made of natural materials, chestnut food,



gathering different leaves from trees and plants in the forest,



choosing a tree (linden) and first observations,



presents – hedgehogs.

NOVEMBER:



exchanging songs of forest animals,



video recording and photo sessions,



recipes with mushrooms,



working on a herbarium.

DECEMBER:



Christmas wreaths using forest fruits (dry berries), cones and branches,



observing the changes on 'our' tree,



different recipes for Christmas using forest fruits.

JANUARY:



observing 'our' tree,



walks in the forest,



winter songs,



hibernating animals – getting to know them.

FEBRUARY



observing 'our' tree,



life in the forest – first awakening plants,



hedgehogs and kurents – Carnival in Slovenia.

MARCH



observing 'our' tree,



first flowers in the forest (spring songs),



completing the herbarium,



presents for Mother's Day – a wild berry cake recipe.

APRIL



observing 'our' tree,



completing the herbarium,



walks through the forest (photo, video),



Easter with forest fruits (blackberries).

MAY



observing 'our' tree,



completing the herbarium,



green and blooming plants in the forest.

JUNE



observing 'our' tree,



finishing the herbarium,



display of final products,



completion of the recipe booklet.

The observed tree will be thoroughly watched and its growth and changes monthly recorded (height, stem, leaves, flowers, fruit).

We will prepare short powerpoint presentation for each month, accompanied with photos and video recordings where possible.

Children will learn different weather songs, songs about animals, forest and nature in general.
